Kristen E Harmon, being duly sworn upon her oath, says that:

I am a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney with the 60th Judicial Circuit, St. Joseph County, State of Indiana, and make this affidavit after reviewing verified South Bend Police reports.

On 12/2/22, South Bend Officer Steven Spadafora was working patrol in South Bend, IN when he observed a red Hyundai sedan speeding. Officer Spadafora initiated a traffic stop. Officer Spadafora approached the vehicle and began speaking with the driver when the officer detected the odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle and observed the front seat passenger holding a rifle. Other officers arrived and instructed the three occupants to exit the vehicle. The rear driver's side passenger, who was later identified as NAGOMBA WHITE, was extremely nervous and responded slowly to the officer's questions. Once WHITE exited the vehicle, officers observed a large capacity .40 caliber drum magazine loaded with live ammunition, , a black Glock 22 semiautomatic hand gun, and a small black device commonly known as a switch. Officers recognized the switch as a device that, when affixed to a semi-automatic handgun, allows that particular gun to function as fully automatic or machine gun. All the items were located near where WHITE was sitting and within WHITE'S reach.

DETENTION CONSIDERATIONS

I. The State has no further information concerning the Defendant's substantial risk of flight or danger to self or others.
